Important Message Regarding Fentanyl Related Overdose Deaths

Attention Healthcare Providers, Hospital, Clinic Administrators and other healthcare professionals:

Please see the [Public Health Warning from the Santa Clara County District Attorney](#). While this report originated in Santa Clara County, we are encouraging healthcare providers to be mindful of these kinds of products. Humboldt County has seen an increase in fentanyl related overdose deaths this year and we are encouraging Humboldt County clinicians to



- Counsel patients to avoid purchasing drugs on the street
- Warn patients of possible fentanyl contamination
- Refer patients who need addiction treatment
- Provide or prescribe naloxone for patients

- The Department of Health Care Services is seeking applicants for the CalAim Workgroups. California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) is a multi-year initiative by the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to implement overarching policy changes across all Medi-Cal delivery systems with the objective of: 1) Reducing variation and complexity across the delivery system; 2) Identifying and managing member risk and need through population health management strategies; and 3) Improving quality outcomes and drive delivery system transformation through value-based initiatives and payment reform. Upcoming Webinars

Overcoming Stigma in Treating Opioid Use Disorder

Stigma is a major barrier to treating opioid use disorder. Clients suffer self-stigma, which prevents them from reaching out for help or from using Medication Assisted Treatment. Providers, meanwhile, are prone to social stigma, which leads to judging clients negatively for their supposed lack of will or commitment to recovery. In this webinar, speakers will define how stigma and the associated bias can hinder patients from receiving treatment for opioid use disorder. Speakers will demonstrate the crucial role that empathy can play in client engagement and treatment retention, and also provide case studies that illustrate specific ways to reduce stigma and provide more effective addiction treatment.
