California Surgeon General Nadine Burke Harris, MD will be joining Senator Mike McGuire at a Town Hall event focused on <u>Adverse Childhood Experiences</u> or ACEs on **Thursday November 21 at the Sequoia Conference Center in Eureka**. More details to come....

Adverse Childhood Experiences are potentially traumatic events that occur in childhood (0-17 years) such as experiencing violence, abuse, or neglect; witnessing violence in the home; and having a family member attempt or die by suicide. Also included are aspects of the child's environment that can undermine their sense of safety, stability, and bonding such as growing up in a household with substance misuse, mental health problems, or instability due to parental separation or incarceration of a parent, sibling, or other member of the household.

A <u>recent article</u> in the <u>CDC Vital Signs newsletter</u> underscores the importance of increasing our knowledge of ACEs and developing programs that support the prevention of ACEs.

<u>Sesame Street in Communities</u> is a project that is providing resources, strategies and support for community providers who interact with families and children. Topics include homelessness, trauma and addiction. 'When a family member struggles with addiction, the whole family struggles. Children often think it's their fault; they feel shame, embarrassment, guilt, and loneliness; they may feel invisible. It takes special effort to start important conversations and answer children's questions. But parents, teachers, caregivers, and other caring adults can comfort children and guide them through difficult moments. With love and support, the family can cope with the challenges of addiction together.'

The project has now officially pivoted to the Technical Assistance or "TA" phase that will enable the project TA through September 2020. TA will be comprised into two tracks. Track one is the General Technical Assistance track provided to all organizations through a number of engagement events, webinars, and opportunities to connect with the TA team for

specific requests. Our website, <u>Addictionfreeca.org</u>, serves as the navigator to this technical assistance track. Track Two is the TA track that focuses on provider organizations that have indicated a desire to either develop new MAT capabilities or to expand capacity to their existing MAT programs.
