






In case you missed it...

with Medication-Assisted Recovery

The National Council recently partnered with the National Alliance for Recovery Residences and the Center for Social Innovation to release Helping Recovery Residences Adapt to Support People with Medication-Assisted Recovery. This guide helps recovery residences that do not have experience with Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) integrate it into their recovery models. A crucial aspect of recovery from addiction is stable housing, but recovery residences may find it difficult to support residents on MAT when they have no prior experience. Helping Recovery Residences Adapt contains overviews of MAT, intake strategies and other tools for recovery residences who are building a more inclusive program.
